Meetings

- Our group will meet twice a month during the school day with the students, the counselor, and the AP.

May 12, 2017: Final Planning Meeting of the Year

August: Care enough students break up into lower grades to give a speech about anti-bullying and how to prevent it and what to expect for the rest of the year.

1. Go to the lower grade classrooms (2nd-5th grade) and give them details on how they may be able to stop bullying.

2. Ask the students if they want to help out and get their opinions on whether or not they think it's okay.

3. Give the students a back up plan on if they see someone being bullied and can't go to an adult right away.

4. The plan being: Try and support the victim and/or try to tell anyone that may be trustworthy.

September: Break the lower grades into small groups and ask them how they feel about bullying and if they want to help (Survey about how they feel about bullying) how they think they can stop it.

1. Make a poster/project slide about anti bullying

3. Make them do a pledge and give it to their teacher to remind them that they want to prevent bullying and their parents.

4. Create a kid council to show the kids they are safe and can get help when they need it and they can feel comfortable talking to them.

October: Come up with activities to do to show we want to stop bullying. Examples; Spirit Week: Monday-compliment day, Tuesday- blank t-shirt day (don't wear a shirt with no words or designs) Wednesday-write KIND things on a sticky note and put on someone's shirt. Thursday-everyone go and get someone a present that has a hard time everyone. Friday-neon day

November: Have our group talk to 6th grade and under to let them know bullying isn't the way. We would pick one person from each class in 6th grade and talk to them about bullying and it's not right so they could spread the word faster

December: Involve police, firefighters, parents etc, to help us stop bullying. Call our local firefighters and police departments as well as paramedics and ask them to speak about bullying and the consequences that go along with it. Paramedics could speak about any suicide attempts they have seen. Print out flyers that will go out to the students to give to their parents about an assembly where police, firefighters, and paramedics will speak about bullying and what parents can do to help their children or any other family members who may need help.
